Why This Matters

Passwords stored the wrong way don't just get "stolen." They get handed over the moment someone gets into your iCloud, email, or Photos.

One leak = every account.

Your password storage method is your real security system.


What's the Safe Goal?

A safe setup means:

- Passwords aren't sitting in plain text
- Face ID protects access
- AutoFill works everywhere
- Every account gets a unique password

You want "locked + private + easy."

The 3 Most Dangerous Places People Store Passwords

<p>✗ Notes App</p> <p>If someone gets into your iCloud account, Notes can be readable fast. Plain text is a gift to hackers.</p>	<p>✗ Screenshots</p> <p>Screenshots often sync to iCloud Photos. That means they're easier to surface than you think.</p>	<p>✗ Emailing to yourself</p> <p>Email is searchable, stored, and targetable. One inbox breach = everything exposed.</p>

THE SECURE OPTIONS

iCloud Keychain (Free + Built-in)

Good for: people who live fully in Apple (iPhone + Mac + iPad)

Pros

- Free
- AutoFill everywhere
- Face ID protection
- Security alerts for weak/reused passwords

Limitations

- Apple-first ecosystem
- Basic organization/features

Settings - Passwords - AutoFill - Turn on Face ID

Offline-First Password Manager

Good for: people who want offline privacy + stronger organization

Why offline-first matters

- Your passwords don't need to leave your phone by default
- You control backups
- You get better organization + secure notes + sharing

Look for

- Face ID unlock
- iOS AutoFill
- Password generator
- Simple, clean UI

- 1 Choose your setup**

 - Want offline + more features? - Offline-first manager
- 2 Lock it (5 min)**
 - Turn on Face ID
 - Turn on AutoFill
 - Create a strong main password
- 3 Migrate the top 10**
 - Email
 - Bank
 - Apple ID
 - Socials
 - Shopping accounts

Generate new unique passwords for each.
- 4 Delete the risky stuff**
 - Notes
 - Screenshots
 - Emails

Every account needs its own password. No repeats.
